

Booking Terms & Conditions

GARDP BSAC Antimicrobial Chemotherapy Conference 2023

Information about Us

Your booking is made with the British Society for Antimicrobial Chemotherapy (the “BSAC”), whose registered office is 53 Regent Place, Birmingham B1 3NJ, United Kingdom and Global Antibiotic Research & Development Partnership (“GARDP”), whose registered office is Chemin Camille-Vidart 15, 1203 Geneva, Switzerland (the “Organisers”, “We” or “Us”) for parties to register and book places to attend your selected event (the “Event”).

Please read these terms and conditions carefully before making a booking.

By making a booking you confirm that you accept these Booking Terms & Conditions (the “Terms and Conditions”) and that you agree to comply with them.

Booking Online

1. By booking through our online system, you are registering yourself, or others within your organisation, as registered parties for GARDP BSAC Antimicrobial Chemotherapy Conference 2023 (the “Event”). When registering for the Event, the party making the booking may be asked to provide information about itself.
2. All registered parties must confirm their name, job title and organisation for the Event. This information is compulsory in order to access the event. By accepting the Terms and Conditions, the registered parties consent to the Data Privacy & GDPR notice provided below.
3. Programme details are correct at the time of wording these Terms and Conditions. We reserve the right to make changes where necessary.

Cancellation

Cancellations are freely open for this Event without any prior notification to the Organisers.

Payment

Please note that this Event is a free event.

Exhibition and Sponsorship

1. The Event will include an online exhibition hall where sponsors and partners will have exhibition stands. These exhibition stands may provide materials about the sponsors or their products or services.
2. Drug-related information and materials will only be accessible to healthcare professionals which will be identified during the registration process. This restriction is made to be in accordance with the ABPI and EFPIA code of practice.

Data & Privacy & GDPR

1. We collect and process the registered parties' personal data, only with their consent, to allow them to access the Event and enjoy the services offered.
2. All registered parties' details will be kept on our records, but We will not share your contact details with anyone.
3. On the day of the Event the registered parties list (name, job title, healthcare professional status and organisation only) will be shared with attendees to facilitate networking and as an opportunity to make connections. This registered parties list should not be used for overt selling, either during or after the Event.
4. By registering for the Event, you agree to participate via video streaming using the link provided in the final joining instructions that will be sent to you approximately one week prior to the Event.
5. Marketing Emails and Communications. By registering for the Event, you are opting in to receive emails, communications and updates regarding the Event, speakers, sessions etc. as well as other relevant information from the Organisers. The Organisers will never share your information with third party suppliers without your permission.
6. We will store your personal data for the duration of the Event and of the communications between you and Us, or until you will opt out to receive emails, communications, and updates.
7. You have the possibility to exercise your rights regarding your data: you may request access to your data, rectification, deletion, limitation of the processing of your data, and data portability. You may also withdraw your consent to the processing of your data at any time. The processing based on the consent given prior to the withdrawal of consent will remain legitimate. 8. You have the right to submit a complaint to a data protection authority, should you consider that we are not making a legitimate use of your personal data.

Third-Party Privacy

We require all third-parties to respect the security of our customer's personal data and to treat it in accordance with the law. We do not allow our sponsors or exhibitors to use our customer's personal data for their own purposes and only permit them to process such data in accordance with our instructions as set out below.

1. What type of information does the Organisers share with third-parties?

We will only provide the following personal data about our customers: contact name, grade and hospital / organisation. We do not provide contact details including: home / work address, telephone number or email address.

2. How must this information be processed and/or used?

Our customer's personal data can be used for statistical or demographic analysis.

3. Who is allowed access to the information?

Verified persons who have the necessary authority and have received appropriate compliance training are permitted to use the data. All third-parties are obliged to respect the confidentiality of this information and to not pass this on to any other organisation.

4. How must the information be stored?

We expect all third-parties to store personal data in a safe and secure environment. Where digital files are kept for storage purposes these must be encrypted in accordance with best practice.

5. What do I do if there has been a data breach in my company?

You must inform the Organisers immediately so we are aware of what has happened and what measures are in place to prevent a reoccurrence.

Post Event Feedback Survey

1. The Organisers consider that feedback is essential in assisting us deliver the highest quality of education and events. To encourage this, We request all registered parties to provide their views after attending the Event via our online feedback survey.
2. The link to the online survey will be emailed to you after the Event, using the email address that you registered with on the online Event portal.
